F2 – This week we have been writing facts about Space. We have shared all the information about Space in our writing and made Planets by printing using inks.

Year 1 – This week we have been looking at odd and even numbers and trying to spot patterns with them. We have also tested materials in preparation for building our houses in DT

Year 2 – This week in Year 2 we have been finishing our diary writing as either William or The Night Gardener. We have completed our writing using great vocabulary. We have been really thinking as writers, we finished it by editing our diaries using a success criteria. Then we were given our publishing paper and wrote our final published version, concentrating on using correct letter sizes. Everyone was really excited to see their work on display in the classroom this morning!



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Year 3 – Excitement is building for Christmas as we have been learning our Christmas songs this week. We have also located the largest counties in England in our geography lesson and started our science topic about light. We learnt about the importance of the River Nile during our Steps to Read lesson and in maths, we focused on multiplication and division.

Year 4 – We have been performing to an audience this week as our 10 weeks of music lessons culminated. We couldn't be prouder of the effort the children have put into this and their performance hit all the right notes.

Year 5 – This week children in Year 5 have been writing up their formal report for the Hawk 7 mission to the moon. They have orally practised their formal vocabulary with talking partners before writing it up independently. They will be bringing home a copy of their work today as they are very proud of their fantastic writing skills – brilliant writing Year 5!

Year 6 – As part of our RE leaning this week, Year 6 have been developing their knowledge of the multiple ways in which Christmas is celebrated in different nations around the world.
